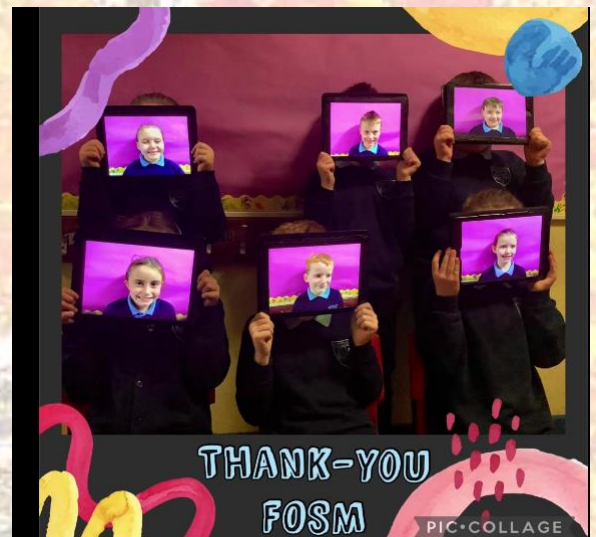
## Coaching

## School Council Impact

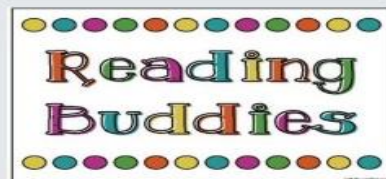
Two of the most impactful initiatives which our school council has led this term, have been the reintroduction of our morning ICT club and a review of Golden Time. Aine supervises our morning ICT Club, allowing pupils to work on LEXIA, Mathletics, Accelerated Reading and many other teacher directed activities between 8.45 and 9am. P4-7 Golden Time now allows for more choice. Outdoor play includes, the lower or upper playground, with access to the mud kitchen, Gaelic, basketball, polytunnel area or play equipment. Indoor activities include, ICT, Art, board games and Lego.

Many thanks to Newtownbutler Credit Union for their generous donation of £1,000 towards school funds.

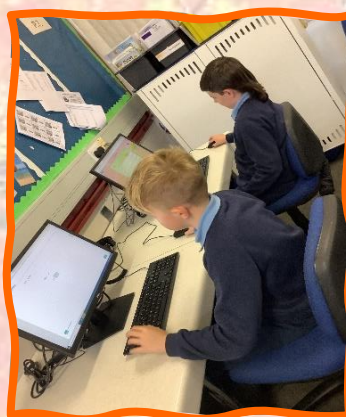

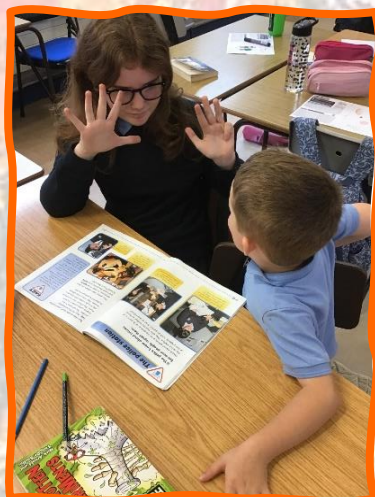
